Announcement and preliminary programme.

The chemical process industries are becoming more and more dependent on model-based computer tools. These tools are beginning to be used in critical roles in design and operation. We need to know how good these models are. However, there are few means available for easily evaluating and quantifying the fitness for purpose, or quality of a model.

This workshop aims to raise some of the issues involved in model validation and seek to find ways to address model quality as an important area for education, research and industrial practice.

Location

The meeting will be held at Norsk Hydro's facilities at Vækerø, in the suburbs of Oslo.

Travel

There are direct flights to Oslo from most major cities in Europe. There are a number of ways to get from the city to the airport:

- Airport express train (Flytoget). This high speed train runs every ten minutes and takes only 19 minutes to Oslo Central. NOK 120 one way.
- Airport buses. These are cheaper and slower (40-60 minutes travel time). The SAS "Flybuss" terminates at the SAS Scandinavia Hotel (NOK 57, every 10 minutes, travel time 55 minutes). The Norway Bus Express busses go to the city bus station (NOK 60, every 30 minutes).
